Mental Health Support and Training: Before half term, the staff received some training from an Educational Psychologist to help them further support children with anxiety and emotional regulation challenges. Our staff are experts in this work, but it is always useful to have a reminder of why we use certain approaches. The care, attention and understanding staff show children helps to build connections and provide expert support when needed. We thought it would be beneficial for all parents to watch the video the staff watched as part of the training. It really explains the science behind our emotions.

## **Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle**

In previous newsletters, we have mentioned Squiggle but I thought I would explain a bit more about it.

It is a developmental approach to early writing. It is ideally for children working in early years, but it can be used as a writing intervention with children from their earliest stages of mark making and physical development right up to Year 1. Squiggle uses neurological and physiological movements to create marks. The 'how to Squiggle' is beautiful and fun.

**Wiggle me into a Squiggler** is the first stage and is designed for the early stages of mark making and physical development used in writing.

**Squiggle Whilst you Wiggle** is the next stage in early years child development and moves on to more advanced mark

making and letter formation

Squiggle me into a Writer is the final stage in our Squiggle Programme taking the child through cursive mark making and letter formation.
