Progress Meetings

This week, Mrs Sach, Mrs Armstrong and Mrs Phelps-Brown (our Special Educational Needs coordinator) have met with all teachers to discuss the progress their classes are making. Our Assessment Governor, Catherine Hulme, also attended some of the meetings so she can share with the Governing Body what happens in Progress Meetings.

During the meetings, we reviewed children's progress in English & maths and, if progress was a concern, discussed what strategies we can put in place to support the child. In the autumn term, several children across the school were put on one or both of our new intervention programmes (Lexia- a reading intervention and/or Dynamo- a maths intervention). In the meetings, we were able to review their progress in these programmes to ensure they are effective. For those children who are making good progress we noted that:

-The child wants to succeed, puts the effort in and works hard -The teacher is determined the child will succeed and gives the support, direction and challenge needed

-The parents support from home, ensuring their child reads every day, spends time learning their spellings, times tables, etc. They also ensure their child does their Lexia or Dynamo at home too. If any parents wish to come and have a chat with our SENCO (Mrs Phelps-Brown) about the interventions, please see the coffee afternoon date above.

Parents attitudes to school work really affect a child's motivation, for the better or worse. By working together we really can make a difference for your child.
