Need to know:

We hope everyone has had a wonderful summer holiday and is looking forward to returning to normal routines. ⁽²⁾ We're very much looking forward to welcoming the children back on Wednesday morning and have planned plenty of wonderful things for the 2023-24 academic year!

Road works outside school: Please be prepared there will be some roadworks outside school at the start of term. Please leave time to allow for this and please park safely and considerately.

School hours: A reminder that all doors in the main school will be open from 8.40am with the register being taken at 8.50am. The school day will end at 3.20pm for all children in the main school. This is due to government requirements that all schools offer a 32.5hour school week. Nursery hours are unchanged but we will monitor the logistics of this and aim to minimise the wait before school.

'Meet the teacher' session: All parents are invited to a session where they can meet their child's teacher and listen to a short talk explaining about the curriculum, homework and how else you can support your child this year. The first session will run at 5pm and another session will be repeated at 5.30pm. After which you are invited into a short talk about the school development priorities for this year.

Medication: Please bring any medication your child needs in school and complete a new health form so we can continue to administer medication if needed. This must be done via the office.

Permission to walk home: In July, Y4, Y5 and Y6 parents will have received a link to the e-form to give permission for their child to walk home. A reminder only children Y4 and above are allowed to walk home (with parental permission) and anyone collecting a child in Year 3 or below must be a minimum of 16 years old.

Clothing for wet weather play: Please send into school a pair of wellies (Reception & KS1) and wellies or trainers (KS2). They should also have a pair of spare jogging bottoms or waterproof trousers to protect their clothing when the field gets muddy.

Play equipment after school: A polite reminder that children shouldn't be playing on any of the play equipment after school hours. Clubs: This half term's clubs will open for booking on Thursday 7th September at 2pm. They will run from Monday 11th September until Friday 20th October for six weeks.
