

Primary PE and sports premium 2025-2026: Funding plan

The government is continuing to provide additional funding for the academic year 2025/26 to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. Schools are encouraged to use the premium for:

- Sustainable improvement in PE, school sport and physical activity.
- Staff CPD (professional development) to boost quality.
- Ensuring inclusive access to sport—targeting disadvantaged pupils, girls, and those with SEND

There are five key indicators that schools should expect to see improvements across:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity (the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend at least 60 minutes per day of which 30 minutes should be in school)
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching P.E. and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport.
